A Message from Janine and Kayleigh:

We would like to start by thanking our parents and carers, this week brought us the inevitable with the rates of infection and cases in the locality increasing but still came as a shock, but having your continuing support, understanding, words of kindness and reassurance has really helped us through.

We will continue to maintain bubbles within Ladybirds for the foreseeable as well as our regular cleaning routines, however, we do still need parents to remain vigilant in recognising symptoms, being prompt in getting tested and isolating until results are returned.

We also would like to remind parents that as part of our measures to keep children and staff safe we are still have to refuse entry to any child who has been given paracetamol or ibuprofen before coming to the setting and we will not be administering either whilst the child is at the setting. Pain relief will also reduce a child's temperature so even if it is taken for other purposes it can then mask one of the 3 main symptoms and in turn may go undetected.

Please can parents also be prompt in letting us know if their child is getting tested, we have to report and record all possible cases and need to know when the symptoms came out and what they were. It is also important we get the results back as soon as possible too.

We appreciate how much disruption this causes families but we again thank all of those who have stuck to the guidance and policies in place.
